- **Driver's criminal history** of prior DUIs can sometimes be used to show a pattern of dangerous behavior.

Why are pedestrian accidents more common during the holidays?

Truck Drivers Can Be Complicated

Why do delivery truck accidents happen during the holidays?

Who can be held liable in a delivery van accident?

- **The corporation**, such as Amazon, UPS, FedEx, or another delivery company, may be held liable under "vicarious liability" if the driver was acting as their employee.
- **If the driver is an independent contractor**, proving company responsibility may require additional evidence.
- **Vehicle owners** can also share liability if the van was leased or rented.
- **Maintenance companies** may be responsible if a mechanical failure contributed to the crash.
- **In some cases, multiple parties** may share fault, making these claims more complex.

What evidence is important in delivery van accident cases?

To build a strong legal case in support of your injury claim or lawsuit, you need to provide strong evidence of wrongdoing. Such evidence can cover a wide range, including:

- **Driver logs** that show unrealistic delivery schedules and long hours worked.
